PROGRAMS & OFFERINGS

RESIDENTIAL (ASAM level 3.1*)

- **Turning Point (Low Intensity Residential Program)**

Turning Point (TP) is a SUD (substance use disorder) residential treatment program for adults 18+ (both men & women) who meet the criteria for low intensity residential treatment, and often have completed a 28-day high-intensity treatment program (although not required). Clients are given the opportunity to further enhance and strengthen their recovery for up to 90 days.

OUTPATIENT (ASAM level 1 - 2.1*)

- **Drug Court Intensive Outpatient (DCIOP)**

Alternative sentencing program serving Strafford County Drug offenders with case management and IOP (intensive outpatient) programming.

- **Impaired Driver Care Management Program (IDCMP)**

Contracted state vendor for mandated DUI assessment/education/aftercare. Certified educators utilize Prime for Life programming.

- **Focused on Recovery for Women (FOR) Intensive Outpatient**

Weekly IOP for women (including pregnant women, and women with children) who are in need of intensive treatment, allowing those who have jobs, and a stable home environment, to gain support from a community of recovering women

- **Outpatient Drug & Alcohol Counseling**

Outpatient services provide individual, group and family psychotherapy, substance abuse evaluations, impaired driver aftercare treatment (those seeking to restore their driving privileges), and assessments with a Licensed Alcohol & Drug Abuse Counselor

*The **ASAM Criteria** is the most widely used and comprehensive set of guidelines for placement, continued stay, transfer, or discharge of patients with addiction and co-occurring conditions. Integers represent benchmarks levels of care and decimals reflect gradations of service needs. Level 0.5 reflects early intervention; level 1 indicates outpatient services; level 2 indicates intensive outpatient/partial hospitalization; level 3 indicates residential/inpatient services; level 3.7 is medically monitored inpatient services (e.g., sub-acute detox); level 4.0 indicates medically managed inpatient services.
