

OUR PROGRAMS



IMPAIRED DRIVER PROGRAMS

IMPAIRED DRIVER CARE MANAGEMENT is for individuals convicted of driving under the influence who are required to attend and successfully complete a state-approved impaired driver program.

The IDCMP program consists of the following:

- Intake and Screening / Substance Use Disorder Evaluation Assessment & Service Plan
- 20-hour Education Classes presented by Prevention Research Institute
- Aftercare Counseling

OUTPATIENT SERVICES

Our convenient OUTPATIENT PROGRAMS include individual and group counseling, evaluations (including court-ordered), level of care determinations, and other services with a Licensed Clinician (MLADC or LADC) specializing in substance use disorders and/or co-occurring disorders.



DRUG COURT INTENSIVE OUTPATIENT PROGRAM (IOP)

Working in partnership with the STRAFFORD COUNTY DRUG COURT, our intensive outpatient phased program for men and women over the age of 18 helps those who are court-ordered to attend in lieu of incarceration.



RESIDENTIAL & SOBER LIVING PROGRAMS

Southeastern NH Services provides healthy, stable living environments in both low-intensity residential programming and independent sober living aftercare to give clients the best tools possible throughout the continuum of care.

TURNING POINT (TP)

This low-intensity residential program lasts up to 90 days and provides adults with a safe, structured, and sober environment to strengthen their recovery. Clients participate in daily treatment while living in a supportive community setting that encourages accountability and connection.

TURNING POINT offers the time and space needed to gradually reintegrate into the community. Clients are expected to follow a phased recovery plan while working or volunteering, attending off-site recovery meetings, and accessing local resources — building a strong foundation for long-term sobriety.

THE KANE HOUSE (SOBER LIVING)

KANE HOUSE is a structured, case-managed sober living residence for men in early recovery. Designed to support continued sobriety and personal growth, Kane House provides a safe, accountable environment where residents can develop life skills, pursue employment, and participate in recovery-oriented activities while receiving support from staff and peers.
